1	Welcome & introductions (including apologies) The group welcomed Kate Thompson, who was attending for the first time. Apologies as above.	
2	Minutes of the last meeting & matters arising Minutes agreed as accurate. a. RH – query re. ROF	
3	Working with MCA Not in attendance. It was agreed that the group would make contact with MCA to try and re-establish attendance if possible.	
4	PHW update (SL) – not in attendance, but update and apology provided by Sion following the meeting	
5	Welsh Govt update (CB) – not in attendance	
6	EU Exit – recent feedback/matters arising – PL provided feedback following CIEH event in Morecambe. Catch Certificate training (Jan 9 th) – direct landings – WG; indirect landings – PHAs. RH – airport – enquiry re. crabs to China – didn't go anywhere PL – language issues on certs – difficult to read	

CT – a lot of extra work might be needed. Elec system being developed by WG Current system – paper heavy

FSA has written to approved premises – need to register if continue to export to EU countries.

CT – what about those that export, but not approved – e.g. live shellfish exporters. Up to LAs to make contact?

TRACES replacement work ongoing – by end Jan?

INS – "import notification system"

Training will be offered

Importers/exporters will need to register

Organics – paper base likely (for imports)

Export Health certs – new system (APHA) Currently 72,000 certs issued annually Possible increase of 300% after March

Fisheries: Monday meeting – clarity required re. likely work, e.g. Anglesey 800 certs issued last year

WG dedicated fishery team – but there's a need to look wider at other POAO/High risk FNAO

Clarity needed re. issuing EHCs – can multi consignments can go on 1 cert?? unclear.

Reg docs too for shellfish – bivalve CCs for fish too

This is in addition to EHCs

LAs need info on potential work

KT: CIEH – involved in "export working group" – making sure voice of EHPs heard and they continue to be recognised as 'certifying officers' for the purpose of signing export health certificates for certain products.

The predicted increase in demand for EHCs -likely to have significant impact on vets and EH. Most vet signed EHCs done by vets in private sector who have received specific APHA training (which they have to pay to attend). APHA concerned insufficient vet capacity so introducing new role of 'certification support officer' as trusted assistants to vets. APHA developing 1 day on-line training for CSOs.

LA staff who are not food authorised EHOs may be able to access the CSO training but CSOs will not be able to sign EHCs. APHA have some concerns about EH capacity. Looking at options.

Concern now re. extra volume of work coming - fishery and composite products

Possibility of other LA (non-food) staff doing this work, if suitably trained.

Private sector? Could they be used?

Also, the issue of some matters being devolved, in Wales

CT: physical/doc check?

KT: physical checks will be required.

KT: what are LAs concerns? E.g. capacity/resources etc. Who's currently doing this work? Can they cope with any additional work? Who else could assist? Private/retired?

PL: if income stream, why not pay LAs?

CT – potential for 24-hour work – would need more than 1 or 2 people, even if income stream could only support 1 or 2 people.

KT: e.g. feed/food funding ring fenced – could similar approach be taken?

GM: WG asked question of possible sharing resources across LA's, especially if work is seasonal etc.

What about WG using Transition Fund to help LAs/small business do this work in first few years.

GM/KT – small business will suffer – cost of EHCs not viable for small consignments

DEFRA/APHA – personnel changes causing issues of consistency etc.

LH: food industry in Wales very important. Could AH officers undertake part of this role?

KT: need to ensure that we future proof the role

CIEH is pushing for this work to be included in the student EHO course

RH: private sector EHOs out there too – possibility

KT: APHA has stressed importance of paperwork/certs – needs to be accurate

GM: update email from SWilkinson APHA – std template for export to EU
